

How are you preparing for this big event? What marks do you want to leave in the city of Lisbon in 2023?





#### 1. Synagogue

This word means "meeting place". In Jesus' time the synagogues were the largest building of a village; they had a simple rectangular structure, with a pitched roof and mosaic pavement; normally facing Jerusalem. On the Eastern wall there was a safe to store the scrolls of Scripture. They were the place of prayer of the community that met on Saturdays for the reading and commentary of some passage of Scripture. Those who read the word of God were on raised platform and the biblical commentary was usually made in a seat reserved for the teacher. The people sat on stone or wood benches found along the walls or on mats on the floor. Men and women gathered indiscriminately in the synagogue, seeing that women could also read passages from Scripture. The Jewish sources place the origins of the synagogues soon after the destruction of the first Temple and, even with the existence of the Temple, in the time of Jesus the synagogues somehow reproduced the liturgy of the Temple.

#### 2. Sabbath

Sabbath is the seventh day of the week, the one that divides the weeks; a day in which you rest after six days of work. However, its significance does not simply come from setting the rhythm of the weeks, but by the fact that it is the day sanctified to God, the day of celebrating God's Covenant with his people. As a day of joy and time of special dedication to God it is a day of rest, prayer and teaching, in

which it is forbidden to perform any kind of work, to travel certain distances, to cook or eat certain foods. Jesus is criticized by the Jewish authorities for performing miracles and healings on the Sabbath.

#### 3. The Scribes of the Law

Men who devoted themselves to the study, interpretation, and teaching of the Law of Moses and other later laws (the Law, for the Jews, is a strong sign of God's presence). They were a kind of theologians, teachers and guardians of the law. In this text, they appear as observers of Jesus in order to pressure him not to perform miracles on a Sabbath day. St Luke reveals the fury of these men in the face of Jesus' prophetic intervention.

#### 4. Pharisees

They were like a religious party whose thinking was based on the importance of purity, compliance with legal prescriptions and works of charity. It was the most prominent group in society, at the time of Jesus. Together with the Doctors of the Law are opponents of Jesus. According to the Pharisees, medical interventions could only be made on a Sabbath day in case of danger of death, which is not the case of the man with a paralyzed hand. They are also furious that Jesus carried out the healing on a Sabbath.

#### 5. Man with the paralyzed hand

Anonymous figure, of whom we do not even know the name, only that his right hand is paralyzed. Certainly, known to most of those present and for whom nothing else can be done.

The object of Jesus' saving action, that frees him from his atrophy and paralysis. The right hand is the hand that that man most needed to live his daily life, to work and develop other activities.

However, the healing of this man is not only a personal benefit granted to him. Wanting that man to be a sign to show his strength and his power as the Son of God, Jesus calls him to his side and commands him: Rise up, as if to say to him: I need you so that through you and what I will do in you, others might believe in the power of my love.

Jesus calls that man with a disability, marginalized and instrumentalized by the doctors of the Law and makes his healing become a sign for others of God's mercy and power being fulfilled.



## What does the text say to me?

Through that man, Jesus showed the world His power to offer life, good, joy. Jesus wanted to need that man to serve Him as an example and testimony.

The Lord wants to need us, too. Jesus gives us the mission of showing with our lives what wonders God's love can work, so that others may believe through our witness.

It is our mission as pilgrims of WYD: to be Jesus's witnesses, in Lisbon 2023, and here, today and now in our daily lives.

Our society needs young people capable of "rising up", letting themselves be healed, transformed and converted by Jesus to stand in the midst of the world, to indicate to others this same path.

Receive now the testimony of a young Italian mother. Chiara Corbella Petrillo, laywoman and mother of a family, wife and mother with great faith in God. She died on June 13th, 2012, at the age of 28, in Italy, by placing the life of the son in her womb before her own. The life of this young mother shows how suffering can be a place of peace and true experience of intimacy with God.

# ASK YOURSELF

- I choose a word or drawing that expresses how I feel when Jesus works miracles in my life and says to me: Rise up, I need you. Write in the second piece Lego.

# RISE UP



Make, with your group, a commitment through which you show others what you have recognized as God's grace and miracle in your lives.


